

The D-Day Landings and the artificial harbour in Arromanches

As from April 2023, the freshly redeveloped D-Day Museum will offer a brand-new 1,200m<sup>2</sup> exhibition area, so that visitors can fully grasp the incredible technological prowess in the construction of this prefabricated harbour - an immense enterprise initiated by Winston Churchill. To help you, the museum's scenography has been redeveloped with the integration of modern media tools, including original video mapping. A new D-Day Museum full of surprises!

This German coastal defence battery is one of the major fortifications that formed the Atlantic Wall. The site has been redeveloped with the addition of a reception building, including information area and boutique, and a green parking area. The roof of the reception area offers a belvedere over the vestiges of Arromanches' artificial harbour.

Juno Beach Centre The Canadian museum modernised

The only Canadian visitor centre on the D-Day Landing beaches stands between Arromanches and Ouistreham, precisely on the spot where the soldiers donning the maple leaf landed in 1944. Come and discover Canada's civilian and military war effort on various Second World War fronts. Soon to be completely redeveloped, the centre's scenography and exhibits will reflect changes in Canada's culture of remembrance. Subjects covered include Canada's military engagement after the Second World War, together with themes such as immigration, diversity, and the voluntary service and activism that forge Canadian society.

A new temporary exhibition on the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) will be proposed as of April 2024.

A key site associated with the combat on Omaha Beach

A major site in the Historical area of the Battle of Normandy, Pointe du Hoc was attacked on the morning of 6 June by Colonel Rudder's rangers. One of the key German strongpoints along the Normandy coast, the site offers an arresting example of an artillery battery, including firing command post, casemates, shelters, anti-aircraft platforms and trenches, and bears witness to the intense combat that was engaged there. The Pointe du Hoc heritage site is managed by the American Battle Monuments Commission and is part of the Normandy American Cemetery.

### Civilians at War Museum

To understand the war through the civilian population's experience. The first part of the museum covers the Occupation, whilst the second approaches the Liberation and the preceding bombardments. The visit is concluded over an immersive film projection placing the visitor amidst the ordeal of the bombardments, on the very spot of the ruins of a house destroyed by bombs in 1944.

### The very heart of history

The Mémorial de Caen has become one of Europe's leading visitor centres devoted to remembrance. Since its creation in 1988, visitors have been offered a delve into 20th-century history over a museum trail covering the D-Day Landings, the Second World War and the Cold War. The complex history of 21st-century conflicts is also depicted through an exhibition of photographs by the special correspondent Patrick Chauvel.

### A verdant haven propitious to contemplation

A total of 70 hectares standing directly above Omaha Beach and housing the graves of 9,386 soldiers, fallen in combat. The visitor centre, chapel, memorial and garden of the missing pay homage to the courage and the sacrifice of all those who took part in Operation Overlord, which led to the liberation of Europe.

A preserved historic site with an explanatory educational trail offering an insight into the battery's operation, the role of each blockhouse and the events around the assault on the morning of 6 June 1944. Casemate No. 1: sound, light, smoke and smells immerse the visitor amidst a deluge of fire and steel, an infernal atmosphere reminiscent of real-life events. Casemate No.2: memorial to the British 9th Parachute Battalion. Casemate No.3: homage to glider pilots, to the No. 3 Commando, to the 45th Royal Marines Commando and the Canadian 1st Parachute Battalion. Casemate No. 4: focusing on the units engaged in Operation Paddle. On site, there is a Douglas C-47 Dakota - the plane that dropped parachutists at dawn on D-Day. The plane is a listed Historic Monument.

In the afternoon, take a heritage tour of the same beaches, as far as Pointe du Hoc, a symbol of the fierce combat waged in the name of freedom. Delve into the emotion of the many sites of remembrance that commemorate these crucial pages in history: the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial in Colleville-sur-Mer, the Arromanches 360 cinema, the Civilians in Wartime Memorial in Falaise, the Battle of Normandy Memorial in Bayeux, the British Memorial in Ver-sur-Mer, etc.

Destination the Graindorge cheese dairy in Livarot (south of Lisieux). You will learn the secrets of livarot and pont-l'évêque cheese making. Then head for the Pays d'Auge or Bessin, where a host of calvados distilleries await you to offer you an insight into all the facets of our Normandy apples. Calvados, cider, pommeau... are offered pride of place. And don't forget our oysters, scallops, 'andouille' chitterling sausage over a gourmet tour of our local producers, always delighted to share their age-old traditional skills.











# Succumb to its architectural heritage

Calvados is the 3rd-ranking French area for the number of listed sites or listed historic monuments. There are around 1,000! You'll discover wonders such as the majestic castles of Bessin: don't miss the Château de Fontaine-Henry, boasting among the highest rooftops in France, or the splendid Château de Colombières surrounded by a genuine moat. And, in the Pays d'Auge, the striking Château de Saint-Germain-de-Livet is sure to enchant you! The list goes on: the very classical Domaine de Pontécoulant, in Suisse Normande, the traditional Manoir des Evêques on the Côte Fleurie, the wonderful church of Sainte-Catherine in Honfleur...
















# Tollow in the footsteps of its famous duke, William the Conqueror

Born around 1027 in Falaise, south of Caen, the Duke of Normandy who became King of England lived a fascinating life. Follow his trail through a tour of 3 emblematic towns: the morning is devoted to a discovery of his childhood castle in Falaise and of the famous tapestry that tells the story of his conquest of England, in Bayeux. Afternoon in Caen and tour of the castle and the two abbeys.













### Stroll through the region's delightful parks and gardens

An ode to nature, over a day tour including several of the following sites. At Jardins du Pays d'Auge, in Cambremer, you'll be taken round a former nursery set out in 27 different features, while the Canon gardens demonstrate the transition between the ordered classicism of the French garden style and the irregular composition of the British style. The landscaped gardens of Vendeuvre castle are also interesting, with their contrasting atmospheres and themed layout. The gardens of the Château de Brécy, where perspective is the belle of the ball and the 4 increasingly wide terraces offer rhythm to the garden. The Colline aux Oiseaux in Caen, in turn, offers 17 hectares of floral parkland, the highlights of which are a vast rose garden and a multitude of themed gardens.







# Take time to contemplate

The religious town of Lisieux is France's most important spiritual spot after Lourdes. A day devoted to the symbolic sites associated with the story of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, whose holy precepts are followed the world over. Visit the Lisieux Basilica and marvel at its jaw-dropping beauty; go and see the Carmelite nunnery and the Maison des Buissonnets, her childhood home. Further west in Calvados, you'll find another gem: the Notre-Dame de la Délivrande Basilica, in Douvres-La-Délivrande.


### Saint-Rémy-sur-Orne

Honfleur

Standing at the entrance to the Old Harbour, the recently restored Lieutenance now houses an interpretation centre on local architecture and heritage. The scenography and exhibition areas are designed to offer an immersive and active tour including audio accounts, virtual re-enactments, scale models, fun activities and exhibit handling, videos, etc. The first room highlights the town's historic importance, the second covers its maritime history and the third its build heritage and archaeological vestiges of the building.




